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# Dear Friends,



We never imagined (pun intended) the response we would get from the *Nightlight* messages on the imagination! Mary had been telling me for months it needed to be addressed. I thought we could do it in about three sessions. We have now recorded nearly ten hours on it and have others ready to record. The notes coming from many of you reveal that Mary's discernment was right: it was long overdue!

The assault on our imagination is an assault on our entire inner being, as it is the doorway to the whole house. Our emotions produce feelings based on what goes on in our image-making mechanism. It is no wonder so many suffer in their minds, when we consider the attack constantly levied against our imaginations. I always think of Peter's reference to how the culture of Sodom vexed the righteous soul of Lot. The demonic atmosphere was a constant irritant to Lot's sensibilities. Yet he chose to remain in it. Why? The same reason we tend to just keep exposing ourselves to the things that we claim injures us. Is it convenience, habit, what everyone else is doing, lethargy, and/or mixed affections in us we are not honest about? Probably some or all of the above.

Proactive protection of the mind (and therefore our emotions and physical energy, which are all united, and both suffer together and are strengthened together) is a daily, moment by moment, warfare. We must WILL (choose) to stay activated in the battle. Defensive guards must become part of our norm. Scott Peck began his famous book The Road Less Traveled with the opening words, "Life is difficult. The moment we realize that fact, life becomes less difficult." That same truth holds regarding the healing and continued protection of our inner life (which is the fountainhead of our entire existence - Proverbs 4:23) Our walk with Jesus demands constant vigilance to be against the world that is against us. We are against the world, not in a polarized posture of negativity, but in a positive

posture of life over death. So we are against the world for the world's good. And once we embrace that reality, it no longer daunts or vexes us. It becomes a negative that empowers our positive. I am motivated towards the good when I see the fruit of insanity all around me. Here's an example...

Natalie Grant is reported to have tweeted as she walked out of the Grammy awards (and I paraphrase), "I have never been more thankful to sing for Jesus... And never more certain of the path I have chosen to follow Him." Comments from many (some supposed Christians) referred to her as homophobic, unloving, the usual. There was the mockery of 37 same-sex couples having a 'marriage ceremony' in the middle of the Grammys. Then two satanic rituals were performed, one by Beyonce (whom Obama claims as his children's best role model). The other was Katy Perry's offering to Baphomet, the horned god of the Knights Templar. The evil is consistent that a same-sex marriage ceremony be performed alongside satanic rituals. The sentimentalist thinks love means whatever the lover chooses it to mean. Remember Satan's motto? "You shall be your own god, deciding for yourselves what is good and what is evil." The critics of Miss Grant were too busy defending homosexual marriage to notice or comment on the satanic rituals.
