

Seek God's Face

If My people, who are called by My Name, will humble themselves and pray, and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and forgive their sin, and heal their land.

2 Chronicles 7:14

What does it mean to seek God's face? The Hebrew reference to the face has to do with intimate, honest, and open communion. Friendship is a 'face to face' relationship. We have in English the expression to 'face the truth.' It is an honest turning of our hidden face into the light of His searching Face. Most of us do not want such naked intimacy with God. Yet He wants nothing less. Seeking His face means that we pursue a level of deep communion with Him on a personal level, where we desire His presence and truth concerning us in our daily lives.

As we seek His face, He will be able to uncover and show us what wickedness He sees in us that has contributed to the sin of the land. And when we deal truly before God with that evil to the point we then turn from it, that very turning will then be the beginning of the transformation God uses to do just what He has promised. He will heal our land when we are no longer contributing to its sickness. God is after our total hearts, our true repentance, our purging and weeding out of the 'little sins' we have tolerated and even secretly enjoyed. He has come to deliver us FROM sin, not IN sin. He has come to redeem our souls by destroying sin and saving us. And He will set in motion forces to and through us for good, that will begin the healing of the land. We are God's people. We are called by His Name. All is not lost. Hope resides in our Redeemer. And we reside in Him. Our anchor of hope holds secure in the love of God.
