Dear Friends,

Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. (Luke 12:32)

This is January - a new year - and I suppose I should write something about New Years. But I don't want to. I just re-watched *A Charlie Brown Christmas*. That's the one where Charlie Brown in total frustration cries out asking if anyone knows what Christmas is supposed to be about. Linus answers, "I can tell you what Christmas is all about, Charlie Brown." He walks to the center of the stage and recites the entire Nativity story. He then returns to Charlie Brown and says, "So, Charlie Brown, that's what Christmas is all about." I always cry. It is not out of some sentimental response to a childhood Christmas cartoon. Rather it is out of the moving transcendent, anointed, min-

ute and thirty-two seconds of Christ-exalting beauty conveyed in that cartoon. It is about the Spirit of truth and love that it conveys.

Yet, there are also other less overt but just as powerful images in *A Charlie Brown Christmas*. Did you ever notice that when Linus gets to the line, "Fear not, for unto you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, which is Christ the Lord," Linus drops his blanket? It is still lying there as he completes his quotation. This birth means you can drop your fear, lay down your insecurities and childish habits, and look up. This One who is come has made it possible for you to go free of your fears.

Then there is the scene where Charlie Brown goes to get a Christmas tree. He is told by the other kids to get the biggest shiniest one he can, but he returns with a scrawny little tree that has no beauty. Charlie Brown says, "This one looked like it needed a home." Its scrawny ugly smallness was closer to the Spirit of the season and not any kin to the modern spirit. For He grew up before Him like a tender shoot, a root out of dry ground...He had no beauty or stateliness that we should look upon Him, no appearance that we should desire Him or be attracted to Him. He was despised and rejected of men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. (Isaiah 53) Of course Charlie Brown is despised and rejected for his despised and rejected tree. When he tries to decorate it, the top can't hold up and bends all the way over to the ground. Charlie Brown laments his broken condition and cries out that he can't do anything right! The symbolism becomes clear to all of us who have experienced our own Charlie Brown bentness. We all need to fall before the Root out of dry ground. The gospel in this cartoon is unmistakably clear.

Yet there is even more wonder revealed. When Linus' blanket is wrapped around the base of the fallen tree that Charlie Brown's brokenness had 'killed', it is clearly resurrected from death and shining with the glory of the Heavenly Light. So...I guess Linus' message to Fear Not and to lay your insecurity blanket at the foot of the tree IS a good New Years' message after all. In the face of whatever may be on the horizon, "Fear not, for unto you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, which is Christ the Lord."
