On the other hand, long term teaching is meant by the Holy Spirit to work deeply in us, and seeds within us an ongoing slow transformation in our thinking, our attitudes, and finally in our actions. Both are needed. Both have different levels of working. But of the two, long term teaching seems to be the most effective in us for life transforming ongoing change as we become more like Him. We have heard from many of you that you sometimes listen to a *Nightlight* recording 2 or 3 times. Our prayer is that the Holy Spirit continues to quicken the growth of these seeds of truth in you as you continue to glean from our *Nightlight* recordings, whether old or new.

So thank you for your kind patience with us. Thank you also for the many who have expressed a renewed level of hunger and interest as the Holy Spirit takes us further up and further in.
